DIVISION HEADS APPOINTED

In consultation with Dr. Willis Snowbarger, Vice President in charge of Academic Affairs, the President has written two letters of appointment for new division heads.

Dr. Vernon Groves has been appointed Chairman of the Division of Education and Psychology. Dr. Groves has served Olivet Nazarene College since 1955. His long tenure and his understanding of faculty needs will have eminently qualified him to take this assignment at this time.

Also, Dr. Max Reams has been sent a letter of appointment as the Chairman of the Division of Natural Sciences and Mathematics. Dr. Reams has served on the faculty of Olivet Nazarene College since 1967.

Dr. Groves replaces Dr. Lora Donoho, who left ONC this summer for a new assignment. Dr. Reams replaces Dr. Clarence Grothaus, who has been willing to carry the responsibility as Chairman of the division for two years past the normal retirement age for administrative assignment.

FRINGE BENEFITS COMMITTEE DISSOLVED

In consultation with Dr. Harold Reed, and after full discussions with the administrative team, President Parrott has dissolved the Fringe Benefits Committee which has served well and worked hard for these past two years. Dr. Mitten, Chairman of the committee, has already asked to be relieved of his responsibility as Chairman and as a member of the committee. Dr. Donoho and Professor Armstrong left ONC this summer for other assignments. Besides the two administrators, this left only two members of the committee, Rev. McMahon and Dr. Whitten. The administrative team will develop a new approach to solving the health insurance problem so that recommendations may be developed and presented to the faculty and staff later this fall and to the Board of Trustees in February. The faculty and staff are indebted to this committee for long hours of hard work.
