2. That you are pleased by the clear rejection of the notion that a child shouldn't be protected if it looks like he/she is destined to have a poor quality of life.

All kinds of opposition is coming from the liquor and broadcasting industries. The National Radio Broadcasters Association and the National Association of Broadcasters have targeted the defeat of Project SMART as their "number one priority."

A spokesperson for Miller Brewing Co. denounced the project in a 5-page letter to the Board of Church and Society of the United Methodist Church, another sponsor of the campaign.
