Mike LaReau

Associate Professor of Sociology
Director, Social Work Program

Dedicated to a field of study in which cynicism is a constant temptation, Mike LaReau remains enthusiastic and optimistic as he combines his professional expertise in social work with his compassion for others. As those who have passed through his Olivet classroom over the past eight years recognize, Mike's compassion knows no boundaries.

Because of the nature of his work, Mike is in contact with a wide variety of people—poor, drug dependent, depressed, anxious, hopeless, lonely. He maintains, however, that “there is not a person alive who doesn't have a future. God made *all* of us to survive and to grow.”

With this perspective as his cornerstone, Mike approaches his students with a sense of mission. “Our job as faculty is not to steer students into a career. Our job is to help them find the truth within themselves that God has placed there to guide them. They have energy, ideas and hope. We have experience, training and faith. That is a powerful, God-given combination for growth!”

Upon reflection, Mike concludes that his early years strongly influenced his decision to later make social work his career. Following his father's death in 1944 and his mother's remarriage in 1948, Mike grew up in a blended family—one natural sister, two stepsisters, one half brother and two half sisters. The successful combination of “his, hers and theirs” had a profound effect on Mike's ensuing interest in social work.

Later, in 1963 while Mike was majoring in sociology at Illinois Wesleyan University, he became a “big brother” to a boy at the Illinois Soldiers' and Sailors' Childrens' School, which was then a large group home for dependent and neglected children from throughout Illinois. This experience led him into a social work position with ISSCS following graduation in 1964. After working there for three years with teenage boys who were abused and neglected, he went to the Jane Addams College of Social Work at the University of Illinois at Chicago, earning the M.S.W. degree in 1968.

Following the completion of this degree, he worked for the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services briefly and then went on to a 20-year social work career at the Kankakee County Special Education Cooperative and Bradley-Bourbonnais Community High School before coming to Olivet to teach social work in 1988.

Mike and his wife of 32 years, Janet, have one daughter, Darcy (Jeneary). Janet and Darcy are both teachers, making the profession of choice unanimous in the LaReau family. Mike is a member of Trinity United Methodist Church in Kankakee where he has attended for 25 years.

Eager to see Olivet's social work program achieve full accreditation by the Council on Social Work Education, Mike is planning for the future. “I have spent virtually all my life in this community; I want to provide a bridge to the community of Kankakee-Bradley-Bourbonnais.”

Mike, for exemplary dedication to your chosen field of study, your boundless compassionate spirit, and your consistent Christian example in the classroom and community, we salute you as the 1996 Faculty Member of the Year.
