FACULTY MEMBER OF THE YEAR

WILLIAM G. FOOTE

Hundreds of Olivetians have been challenged and enriched through exploring the world of humanity and reason found in great literature under the teaching of Professor William Foote. For Bill, this year marks a quarter century of service in Olivet's classrooms.

Having been converted at Chicago First Church, Bill attended Olivet from 1944 to 1949, earning a degree in English, and graduating only two hours short of a second major in history. He majored in biblical literature while at Nazarene Theological Seminary, earning his B.D. in 1952. He pastored Nazarene churches for 16 years and in 1961 took a full-time teaching position in the Kankakee public schools while continuing to pastor our local Limestone congregation. During the next several years Bill pastored, taught full-time, and pursued graduate work at the University of Illinois, earning a Master of Arts degree in 1968.

In 1967, Bill was invited to teach a literature class at Olivet. An invitation to teach full-time followed from then-president Dr. Harold Reed. "I started thinking about it and praying about it and felt that this was where my ministry should continue," Foote said. "My ministry was always like a teaching ministry, even when I was pastoring."

Since becoming a full-time member of Olivet's faculty in the fall of 1968, Bill has taught most of the courses offered by the English Department at one time or another. "To me, one of the

most rewarding things is to get a really good class discussion going," Bill notes. "I don't need a cup of coffee or anything else to lift me up — teaching is a dynamic thing; it's not just a textbook wired for sound. Part of what drives me is that I have a great curiosity; I am always wanting to learn. It's fun to me — fun to teach — and that's one reason I keep pushing myself to try new things, to read new things."

In addition to keeping current through scholarship, Bill recognizes the changing culture of today's students and seeks to accommodate the students' needs. "We're in a media generation," he observes. "What's happening now in the media is just as revolutionary as when books were first printed. We need to make the adjustment."

Bill and his wife, Reuhama, a career public school educator, are active members of College Church of the Nazarene where he has taught Sunday school for 14 years and has been a member of Chancel Choir since 1965. Bill is also well-known throughout the Kankakee area as husband to Reu Foote, a prize winning garden club enthusiast.

When not teaching, Bill can be found traveling, or yes, reading great books. The Footes have traveled extensively throughout the U.S., England and Scotland, as well as Europe.

For your commitment to the ideals and mission of your alma mater, Olivet Nazarene University, and for your spirit of collegiality and support, we affirm your ministry among us and salute you as the 1993 Faculty Member of the Year.

to work in the church's children's department ever since. Both Joyce and her husband John are active members of College Church of the Nazarene, where she has worked in the three-year-old nursery for 32 years.

When she's not at work in the ONU Bookstore she's pursuing her hobbies in the following order: loving grandchildren (blessed with 5, ranging in age from 11 years to 9 months), growing and arranging flowers, or reading good books.

The Muhms have two daughters: Pam holds a doctorate in nursing and heads a rehabilitation hospital in Boston, Mass., and Pat has a doctorate in special education and lives in Champaign, Illinois.

Joyce approaches the workplace with a sense of mission. "I think your attitude in being around people is important; you can show a Christian attitude, or you can really turn people off," she said. "Attitudes are important; whether someone comes to school here or not could depend on how one person treated them; whether they acted as if they cared or not."
