President's Special Recognitions

Faculty Member of the Year

Dr. Gary Wayne Streit was born in the beautiful community of Winchester, Virginia, a gathering place for the people of the great Shenandoah Valley.

Gary is the only Nazarene in his family of five brothers and one sister. As Gary says, "I am a Nazarene by choice."

Gary received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Trevecca Nazarene College in 1967, and a Master of Science degree from the University of Tennessee in 1973. In this interim of six years, he served as a public school teacher in Virginia and Tennessee. Gary arrived on the campus of Olivet in 1973 to teach English and serve as the Director of the Career Planning and Placement Center. In 1982, Gary Streit received a Ph.D. degree from the University of Illinois.

During his thirteen years at Olivet, Dr. Streit has served as (1) Professor of English, (2) Director of the Career Planning and Placement Center, (3) Chairman of the Department of English, and finally, (4) Director of Graduate Studies.

Dr Streit has published in the Illinois English Journal, traveled extensively throughout the United States, and led four study seminars for students in Great Britain and the Netherlands. For eleven consecutive years he has presented papers or conducted sessions at the National Conference of English Education. Presently he serves as a Consultant/Evaluator for North Central Association of Colleges and Universities.

Dr. Streit is an active member in three professional organizations: (1) The National Council of Teachers of English. (2) The Conference on College Composition and Communication. (3) Midwest Association of Graduate Schools.

Gary is a good churchman: he has served eleven years on the Board of College Church, has been chairman of the Board of Christian Life, a member of the Finance Committee, and a member of the Chancel Choir for thirteen years. From 1982 to 1985, Dr. Streit served as the Alumni President of his alma mater and a member of the Board of Trustees of Trevecca Nazarene College.

Gary is married to the former Marla Moore. Her Bachelor of Arts degree from Trevecca, Master of Library Science and Master of Arts and Education from George Peabody College have prepared her well for the assignment she fills as Media Specialist and Librarian for the Bourbonnais Upper Grade Center.

The Streits have a daughter, Emily, who is in the first grade at Robert Frost School.

At this particular time when he is giving strong leadership to the growth and development of the Division of Graduate Studies at Olivet, it seems natural for the Faculty Member of the Year in 1986 to be Dr. Gary Wayne Streit.

Mr. Douglas Elliott Perry was born in Freeport, Illinois and raised in the Kankakee Community. His parents, Dr. and Mrs. Ralph Perry served as pastors in Freeport and later in the First Church of the Nazarene, Hammond, Indiana. His late father, Dr. Ralph Perry was a central figure in the faculty and administration of Olivet for twenty-five years as Professor, Registrar, and Director of Graduate Studies. Doug is a grandson of a former president of Olivet Nazarene College.

Doug Perry graduated from Bradley-Bourbonnais High School in 1964, and received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Mathematics at Olivet in 1968, followed by a Bachelor of Science in Accounting in 1979. He passed the examinations to become a Certified Public Accountant in the State of Illinois in 1980 and graduated from the Executive MBA program at the University of Illinois in 1986 with a Master's Degree in Business Administration.

Mr. Perry served as a public school teacher in Mathematics from 1968 to 1975. He began work at Olivet in the Supervision and Collection of Student Accounts in 1975, became Assistant Business Manager in 1978, Budget Director in

1980 and Business Manager in 1983. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the First Trust and Savings Bank of Bradley.

Mr. Perry is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, a member of the National Association of Accountants, and a member of the Christian Business Mens Committee, both local and international.

Douglas Perry is married to the former Sheila Oswalt of Hammond, Indiana. They have a son, John Leslie, age seven, in the second grade of Robert Frost and a daughter, Lauren Ann, age six, in the first grade of Robert Frost.

Doug and Sheila Perry are active members of College Church where he has served on the Board. He has also been a Treasurer of the Nazarene Credit Union.

During the last meeting of the Board of Trustees, the President recommended Mr. Perry for a change of title from Business Manager to Chief Financial Officer. However, members of the Board picked up on the idea and passed a motion on their own which made Doug Perry Vice-President for Finance.
