# President's Special

## Faculty Member of the Year 1984

**Dr. Harry R. Westfall** is serving as Chairman of the Division of Education and Psychology, and Director of Teacher Education for Olivet Nazarene College.

Harry Westfall was born and raised in Indianapolis, Indiana. His early spiritual nurture came from membership in the congregational family of Indianapolis Westbrook Church of the Nazarene. After graduating from the Ben Davis High School in Wayne Township, Harry served three years in the United States Armed Services during World War II, mostly in an overseas assignment during the campaign for Italy. Returning home after the war, he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Oakland City College, a Master of Arts from Butler University, a Bachelor of Divinity from the Nazarene Theological Seminary, a Master of Science from Purdue University, and ultimately a Ph.D. from Purdue.

He began his teaching career in the Stephen Decatur Elementary School for more than eight years. For one year, with rank as an instructor, he participated in teacher morale research at Purdue University, and then came to Olivet where he has served faithfully and well for approximately eighteen years.

Harry and Frances Westfall have a son, Bob, and a daughter, Ruth Weber, with two granddaughters, Angela and Becky Westfall, and a grandson, Michael J. Weber.

Dr. Westfall is a member of the Chancel Choir in College Church where he also serves on the Board of Christian Life. He is a member of the Bradley-Bourbonnais Exchange Club and has been faithful in his support of the men's prayer-breakfast meetings in College Church. He declares his hobbies are primarily the upkeep of his home and his automobiles.

**Mr. Phillip N. Richardson** is manager of the Olivet Nazarene College Bookstore and Post Office located in Ludwig Center.

Phil was born on January 9, 1935, in Macon County, Missouri, to Dwight and Ollie Richardson. His parents were poor farmers. He attended grade school in a one-room building where all eight grades were taught by one teacher. He graduated in 1953 from the Macon High School and two years later, in the fall of 1955, entered Olivet Nazarene College as a freshman. He worked to put himself through college while he carried a part-time load. His schooling was interrupted by a three-year stint in the United States Army from February 1959 to April 1962. For two years of that time he was stationed in Germany.

Phil returned to Olivet in 1962, and married Sharon Myers in November. He graduated from Olivet in 1964, and went to work for the Nazarene Publishing House in Kansas City the following January. There he served as Organizational Manager which included supervision of Purchase Order and Sales Departments, Shipping, Film Rental, and Bulletin Subscription Departments.

In the summer of 1978, Phil Richardson heard about the need for a new manager for the Olivet College Bookstore and Post Office. After small negotiations, he accepted the assignment and has served with distinction for these last six years.

The job description for Phil Richardson includes the purchase of all textbooks and bookstore gifts and merchandise which is made available to students, and used as the source of supplies for all campus offices. In overseeing the Post Office, he is responsible for the receiving, forwarding, and distribution of faculty, staff, and student mail.

Phil has served on the Friends of the Bourbonnais Library Board, College Church Board, and for four years was secretary of the Board of Directors of the Central Education Zone Federal Credit Union. His hobbies are gardening and woodworking plus the joy of reading. Their children are Lonnie, Todd and Staci.

Phil and Sharon are a great plus on this campus. He is professional in his work and easily entreated in the multitude of exasperating details that go along with his assignment. He has well deserved the designation given him tonight as the Staff Member of the Year 1984 at Olivet Nazarene College.
