# President's Special

## Faculty Member of the Year

**Dr. Carolyn S. Sechrist** has been chosen the 1983 Faculty Member of the Year at Olivet Nazarene College for her contribution in the college classroom and the Counseling Center. Students who have taken her courses in the Theories of Personality, Psychopathology, and Psychotherapy have been inspired, many of them determining to go on in graduate work in psychology. In addition to these basic courses, Dr. Sechrist developed a course in Psychology and Biblical Integration which is now included in the regular curriculum. Any professor whose classes inspire students and help them in making decisions for graduate study deserves recognition and appreciation.

In addition to her classroom work, Dr. Sechrist has a half-time schedule in the Olivet Counseling Center where she specializes in relational and adjustment problems faced by college students. Two hallmarks of her counseling expertise have been integrity and helpfulness.

Back in Elkhart, Indiana, where she grew up and attended high school, the parents of Carolyn Sechrist sacrificed to help her graduate from Olivet. She is a first generation college student in her family.

After graduating from Olivet in 1968, Carolyn had two years of work in Panama City, Florida, as a staff psychologist in an experimental program for persons with undergraduate degrees who could be supervised by professionals. Her success in this job opened the door for graduate study in Rosemead School of Psychology in California where she had an assistantship which included all tuition plus a living stipend.

After receiving her Ph.D., she worked for a year in the Alhambra Neuro-Psychiatric Clinic and Hospital to complete her work as a licensed clinical psychologist.

Carolyn, we salute you for being chosen the 1983 Faculty Member of the Year at Olivet Nazarene College.

Last year, **June Hayman** labeled, sorted, and mailed more than 600,000 letters, catalogs, and newspapers from her printing and mailing office. She turns out enough paper to flood the campus, but without it we could not function. She duplicated 1.2 million copies of materials last year.

Since 1970 when he was appointed Assistant to the Registrar, **Clifford Hayman** has been involved in the registration records of more than 10,000 different students at Olivet. His work involves the entire gamut of student records from initial registration for classes through grade reports, diplomas, and transcripts.

June and Clifford Hayman are a team within a team, always on time, seldom absent, and almost never unavailable. They are excellent examples of high quality staff at Olivet Nazarene College. We congratulate them on being chosen the 1983 Staff Members of the Year at Olivet Nazarene College.
