Firms Throw Pennies Away To Save Dollars

NEW YORK (The Evening Journal)—The New York City Tax Department is fighting favorably today with a growing number of economy minded business firms.

It is the whole-dollars-and-no-cents accounting. It means eliminating the posting of pennies in a company's books by rounding out each figure to the nearest dollar. Over a 10 per cent reduction in the average outlay of the same with traditional book keeping methods.

The Contershipers' Foundation is attacking the pennies. It says that the practice of rounding brings savings up to 89 per cent in posting and 43 per cent checking.

The foundation, research arm of the Controllers Institute of America, says the commonly used formula rounds upwards the amount of 51 cents and over, and rounds downward amounts of 49 cents and under.

Major Breakthrough For Missiles: Solid Fuels With A Rubber Base

WASHINGTON (NEA) — Gilbert Swart stared moodily at a thick, black liquid being poured from a hot can into a long cylindrical mold. "You know, I bet if you start pouring it over instead of asphalt, you'll solve your stability problems," Swart said to Dan Kim, the man standing next to him. "We want it to burn, not bounce," Swart replied, "but we'll try any way."

His conversation took place in the small California plant of Aerojet-General. The result to him is one of the few bright spots in the U.S. ballistic missile and space flight picture.

It led to the first major breakthrough in developing a satisfactory solid-fuel for rockets.

SUBSEQUENT improvements in the Navy's intermediate range ballistic missile, Polaris, are the country's most promising weapons.

The most important for the future solid rocket fuels appear to be adaptable to existing on space for the moon, for the re-entries of space machines.

THE FOUNDATION studied whole dollar accounting by 13 firms to see how well averaging out worked. It reports Bethlehem Steel's warehousemen use pennies to average out a million dollars of illuminating Co. sales. The company's sales are less than \$5 a month, so annual gross revenues of 107 million dollars don't change much.

The foundation says that the great volume of accounting statistical work occurs not in sales but in inventory accounting, internal accounting and analysis of operations. It finds Pan American's inventory accounting system costs 25 million key punch strokes a year by using whole-dollar accounting in the book keeping stage.

Syracuse Supply Co. cut in half the time it used in posting general ledger entries by using pennies. It can handle a larger volume of business without increasing accounting personnel.

CENTRAL SOYA Co. estimates that its 100,000 pennies save each of its bookkeepers one hour a time a day in posting and accounting figures for reports.

Dravo Corp. uses pennies for three days of work each month in

preparing reports.

For S. L. Adams, Columbus, Ohio, department store, records cash and charge account transactions, and the company registers, but at the end of each day transactions are rounded to whole dollars for posting to the general ledger department. It reports several million dollars a year eliminated from reports.
