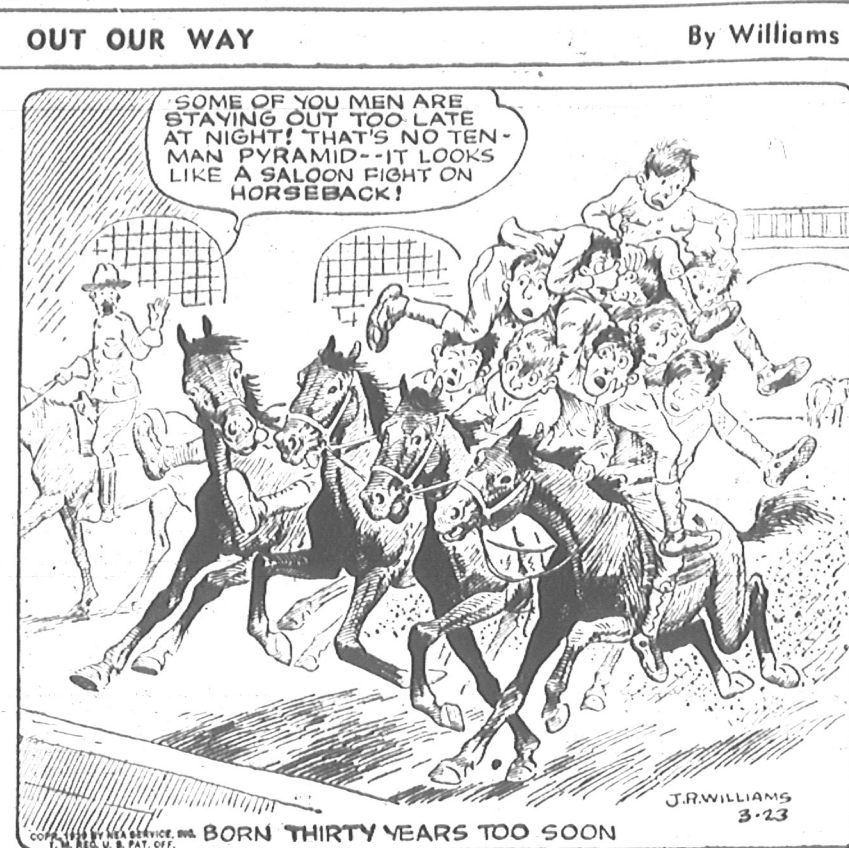

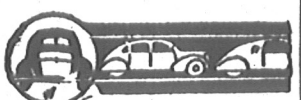

Fear Nazis May Go Further Than Domination of Europe

London, March 23.—(P)—Prime Minister Chamberlain told the house of commons today that Germany's recent diplomatic actions raised the question whether Germany "were there" to stay or to dominate Europe.

The prime minister added: "Were this interpretation of the intentions of the German government to prove correct, the majority's government would be bound to say that as similar attempts have been made in the past this would raise the successful resistance of this and other countries who have their freedom."

Chamberlain rejected a suggestion by Sir Alfred But, government supporter, that he propose to France, Belgium, Australia and the union of South Africa that they incorporate the former German colonial possessions which they now hold under mandate from the League of Nations.

The prime minister's reply was: "No, sir. I do not think the suggestion would have the effect that my friend has in mind."

Sir Alfred argued that his proposal would be "an answer to German aggression in Europe," Chamberlain said:

"I wish to make it clear that there is no desire on the part of his majesty's government to stand in the way of any reasonable efforts on the part of Germany to expand her export trade."

"Nor is this government anxious to set up in Europe opposing blocs of countries, with different ideas about the forms of their internal administration."

"We are only concerned here with the proposition that we can not submit to a procedure under which independent states are subjected to such pressure under threat of force as to be obliged to yield up their independence, and we are resolved by all means in our power to oppose attempts, if they should be made, to put such a procedure into operation."

Hungarian Troops Advance
Budapest, March 23.—(P)—Hungarian troops moved into Slovakia today at several points along the Slovakia-Czechoslovakia frontier, said reliable reports from that

country.

Poland Active
Warsaw, March 23.—(P)—All available rolling stock of the Polish railway administration in Danzig and Gdynia was being hurriedly withdrawn today from both cities, leading some observers to believe that Polish troop movements were impending.

The withdrawal of freight and passenger cars and locomotives recalled similar activity during the September crisis. Inflamed circles here expected large scale troop movements in the Polish corridor.

The corridor and the Free City of Danzig separate the two parts of greater Germany. Gdynia, Poland's chief port, lies at the head of the corridor on the Baltic near Danzig. Both Danzig and the corridor were German territory before the world war.

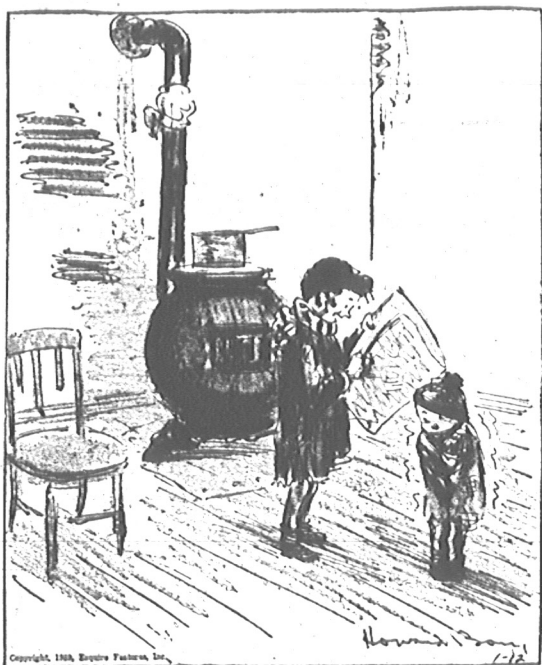

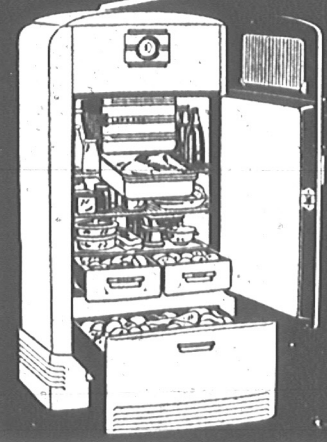
