Critics To Ask For Restriction Of Vast Powers

Proposed For FDR In Lease-Lend Bill Now Before Congress

Washington, Jan. 11.—(AP)—The house military affairs committee voted today to demand that the administration's British-aid bill be withdrawn from the foreign affairs committee and placed before it for consideration.

William Byrnes (D-S.C.) who participated in preliminary conferences on the proposed lease-lend bill today said it was likely that if approved the bill would give the president the power to transfer the vast power which the war production act gave upon the president.

Byrnes said that the bill would make for a complete correlation from start to finish between the British use of the American production facilities and the American production.

Governor-Elect Green Silent On Patronage

No Appointments Will Be Announced Until After Inauguration

Chicago, Jan. 11.—The Republicans who want Dwight H. Green to give them good state jobs have at least two more days to wait and hope.

The governor-elect has specialized in silence about patronage and the expected job-seekers who will attend the inaugural ceremonies at Springfield Monday expect to crowd the senate galleries when the legislative reconvenes.

Mr. Green said today no appointments will be announced until after the inauguration. He didn't elaborate, but the patronage seekers expect to get their first official information when the senate is adjourned to the senate for confirmation.

It was inferred from the governor-elect's brief comment that the men who will make up the Green cabinet will have been privately notified, but the secrets have been closely guarded.

Rank-and-file Republicans anticipate that Gilbert Krebber of Chicago will move into the state house with the new governor. But the specialists in speculation haven't agreed on what his title will be—finance director, administrative adviser or a place among the inner circle.

A real estate man, Krebber has been major donor of Green's post-election headquarters here.

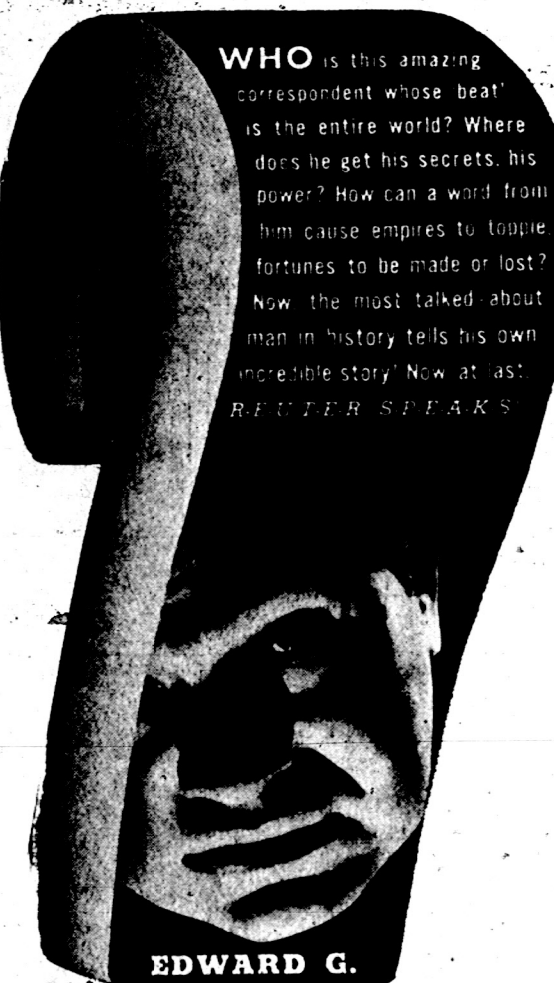
