## Pro-Amateur to Open Links Battle

Pairings for the annual Illinois State Professional Golfers' association tournament, which opens Friday afternoon and runs through Sunday at the Highland Country club course were announced today by officials of the meet. With entries being accepted until ten Friday morning, the field, which already totals 69, makes it expected to reach and may even exceed 70.

## Rains Reduce Threats Of Drought To Corn, Soybeans

Springfield, Ill., Aug. 13—(AP)—An incipient threat of drought damage to Illinois corn and soybean crops was reported reduced somewhat today by rains which fell over most of central and northern Illinois.

The weather bureau reported the heaviest precipitation was at Kankakee where 1.04 inches was measured. Other reports showed Griggsville had .78 hundredths of an inch of rainfall, Urbana .50, Ottawa .39, Freeport .38, Moline .20, Havana .41 and Springfield .40. Southern Illinois reported little or no rain, with four hundredths of an inch falling at Olney, a trace at Effingham and none at Cairo.

Some Light Showers  
Some central and north central Illinois points had only light showers. Bloomington reporting only .07 inches and Peoria .08 inches.

Crop analysts of the federal and state departments of agriculture reported the showers, while of substantial temporary benefit, fell short of the soaking rains needed to beat out earlier prospects of a near-record state corn crop and a record production for soybeans.

Notes  
A weekly crop report of A. J. Suratt, senior agricultural statistician, referred to the rains and resultant cooler weather as bringing a welcome change that will be of temporary benefit, particularly to the later corn.

Suratt said, however, that the condition of corn soybeans and other growing crops showed further decline from the favorable August 1 prospects during the heat and third week of hot weather, with drought conditions becoming more widespread.

Damage Reported  
Excepting on bottomlands and in scattered areas benefited by showers, the field crops have been seriously damaged in the southern third and particularly in the south-western part of the state where much of the corn has been badly fired, the report continued.

"Severe crop damage has now extended northward to lighter soils in the drier areas of the central and northern portions of the state. To a lesser extent this applies to scattered dry spots in the northern third of Illinois. Generally speaking, the favorable crop prospects in the northern section have been maintained."

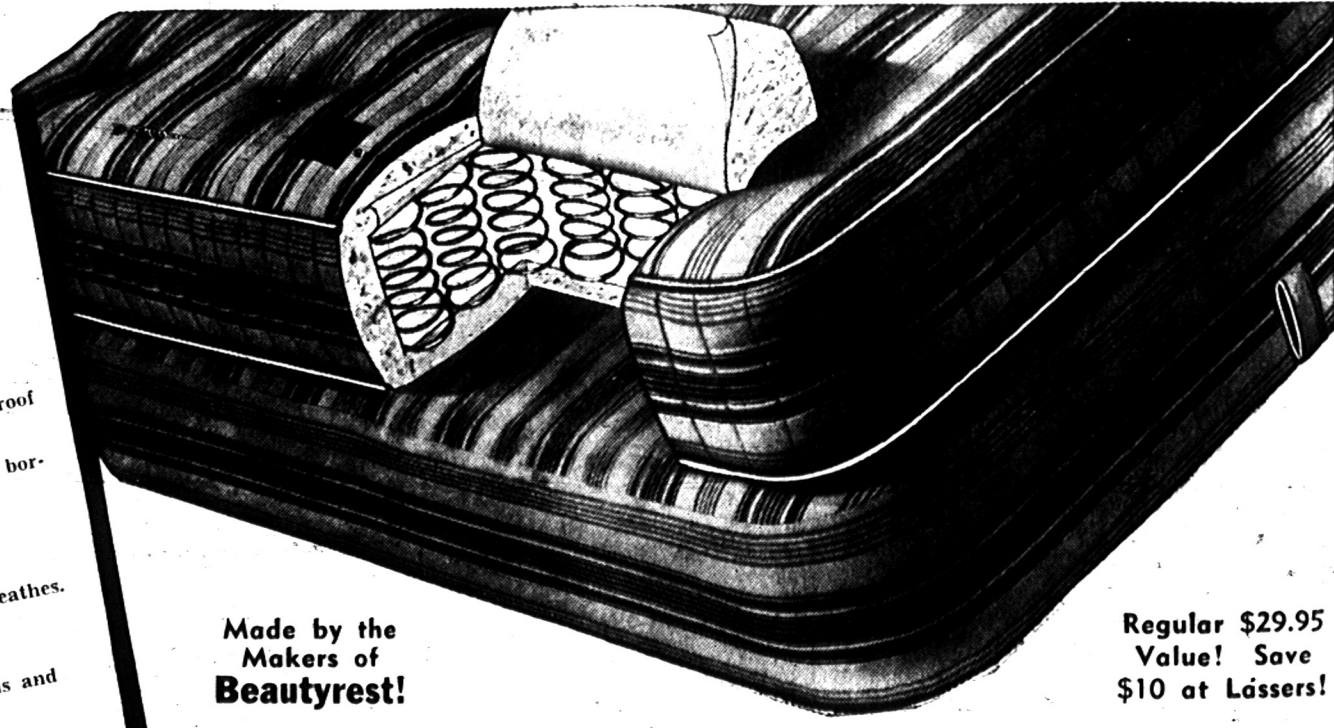
