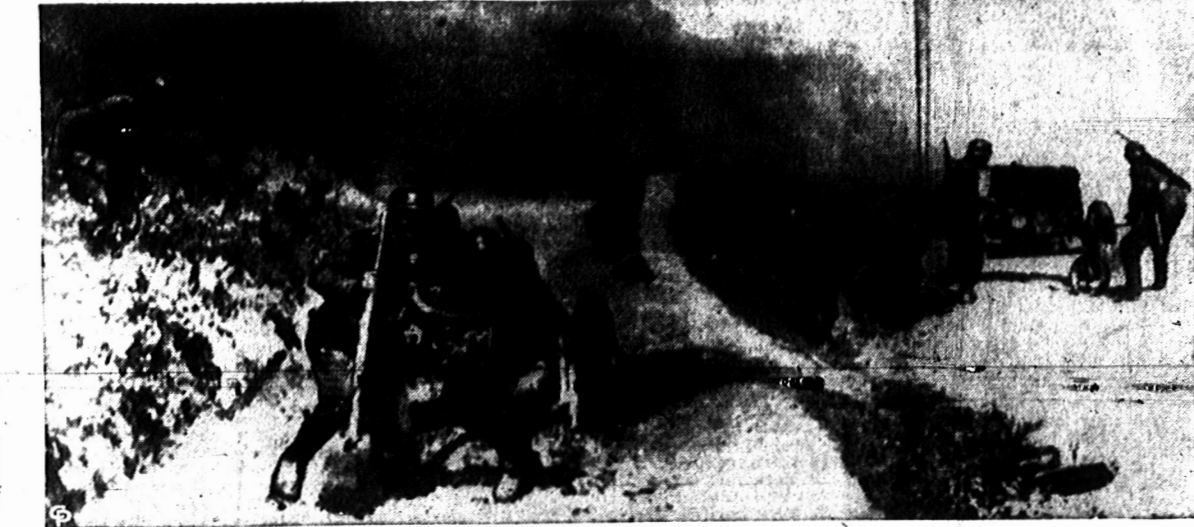

Gas Rationing Begins Today



In The East

Washington, Aug. 16.—The government ordered gasoline rationing for the east today. The strategy was the man at the fuel pump assumed new importance in the case of 10,000,000 motorists.

Piling station operations will be in direct control of the government at the end of the conservation program, deciding how to divide their reduced supply among customers.

The rationing order, issued by the office of price administration and civilian supply (OPACS), calls for a 10 per cent slash in the volume of gasoline to service stations. However, the reduction in non-essential use of gasoline, such as in pleasure cars, is expected to amount to 20 per cent, since under the order commercial, emergency, farm and gov-

Fire engines, ambulances, physicians' cars, farm tractors, commercial vehicles, government automobiles, and other such essential cars must be fueled, but after that it is up to the filling station operator to determine how to spread the remaining supply among his customers.
