ARITHMETIC TESTS CHILD PERSONALITY

Most Significant of All Studies; Psychologist

Waukegan, Ill., May 9.—(UP)—If your boy likes arithmetic, it's an indication he was an effective personality, a child psychologist said today.

Dr. Martin L. Reynert, incoming president of the big brothers and sisters association of Illinois and director of the laboratory for child research, Mooseheart, Ill., said that in child personality tests arithmetic was "the most significant of all the studies, especially among the boys."

"Arithmetic represents a set of habits which are of basic importance in dealing with other people fairly and squarely, not only in such simple acts as sharing the cost of a luncheon, but in keeping score, in the household budget, in business, in a thousand and one social situations."

Dr. Reynert said that doing well in arithmetic studies was found to have little or no bearing on personality but that the liking or dislike for certain studies was "very significant."

"The group of activities and habits found to contribute most toward personality were physical games and competitive sports," he said in an interview during the eighth annual conference on delinquency prevention.

Table tennis and bridge had a high value among boys and girls; pool and billiards, a lesser value for boys; checkers and chess, a slight value, while social dancing was by far the most important of the social games "and in fact one of the most important of all the skills contributing to personality," he said.

Among other activities contributing to personality, he found, were dramatics, participation in school, young peoples and church societies, boy and girl scouts, and playing a musical instrument contributed more for girls than boys, although coin collecting was significant among boys and not among girls. Nature study was particularly important among girls, and photography, collecting stamps, autographs and photographs among both groups.

Self Determination
The hobby of listening to the radio had no significant bearing, in fact was slightly negative, among boys, he added.

Habits of self determination showing the child has been properly trained by the parents, he said, included:

Persisting in games and sports even though awkward; doing the less pleasant task first, not using the words "I can't do this" or "I am no good at this" controlling outbursts of temper, finishing a task once started, refusing to be discouraged, not brooding over mistakes and hard luck, have some definite vocational or education plan.

EXTRAORDINARY POWERS GIVEN POLISH CHIEF

Will Strengthen Nation's Defensive Activities

By W. A. BESTERMAN
Warsaw, Poland, May 9.—(UP)—Parliament today granted President Ignacy Moscicki extraordinary powers in all military and economic matters necessary to strengthen the country's defensive power.

The president's powers will be operative until Nov. 1.

Roused by the necessity for complete and unquestioning national unity at a time of emergency, the sejm or parliament granted the powers by unanimous vote. Even the Ukrainian and Jewish members, long in opposition, cast their votes for the extraordinary powers.

Diplomatic Tour

The extraordinary powers vote was taken as the city awaited the arrival tonight of Vladimir Potemkin, Russian vice foreign minister, on a brief visit which it was believed might prove decisive as regards Russia's role in the British-French "security" front.

It was disclosed officially that he would be here for 12 hours, his last stop on a remarkable diplomatic tour which has taken him to Turkey, Bulgaria and Rumania—key states in any Black sea combination as Poland would be to a Baltic combination.

As the result of this tour, it was expected that Russia would at once name a new ambassador to Poland and a new minister to Rumania.

The Russian embassy here has been in care of a charge d'affaires since the recall of Jacob Gavytan, the last ambassador, in November, 1937, and he has not even seen Col. Josef Beck, foreign minister. A young secretary has had charge of the Russian legation to Rumania for more than a year.

There was no announcement as to any engagements for Potemkin to see Polish leaders, but it was assumed he would establish contact with Col. Beck and political quarters saw the visit as indicating that Polish-Russian reconciliation had been brought considerably closer to realization.

Baltic Negotiations
As Russia and Great Britain conferred on the terms of a security front at Moscow, Poland was busily negotiating with Baltic nations. Gen. Stasys Raschtkis, commander-in-chief of the Lithuanian army, arrived today for a two day visit to Marshal Edward Smigly-Rydz, inspector-general of the Polish army and "strong man" behind the government.

Well informed quarters said that Poland positively would not enter into any contractual ties with Russia beyond the existing non-aggression treaty and it was said also that there was no question of Poland accepting direct military aid from Russia. But it was added that otherwise there was no hindrance to closer relations.

Economically, Polish-Russian relations have shown strong improvement in the last month. Soviet deliveries, particularly of iron ore, have increased markedly.
