went begging and now, according to British officials, the premier himself has fled into Iran. It also was reported, without confirmation, that Hashid Ali and his aides took with them—perhaps the last bargain with the child king of Iraq, six-year-old Faisal II.

The German high command said the pursuit of British and Greek forces eastward over the mountains and coastal plains of 100-mile long Iraq, was lightening an axis which the last, die-hard defenders of the Greek island.

The Germans were reported about to launch a new offensive against Crete in the last stages of the invasion. Defenders still in the fight were in between.

The high command said some of the British and Greeks had fled to the south coast of Crete, where the Luftwaffe pursued them with bomb and machine-gun while also blasting at Crete's southern ports to smash the sea link.

Other defense forces were reported seeking the comparative safety of Egypt in what boats they could muster on the Crete shore.

Authoritative London sources "predicted" that Britain had granted the Iraq plea for an armistice, adding "as between ourselves and the rebels, the whole thing is over." The armistice was understood to have come from a committee in London headed by Lord Raglan.

The prospect of full-scale war in Iraq was a ticklish problem for French neighbors, Turkey and French-mandated Syria. Turkey was still in a quandary as to whether to fight at Britain's side. Thus far, she has not been allied with Britain.

The French in Syria, already beleaguered by British bombing of Syrian airbases used by Iraq-bound German planes, undoubtedly will be called upon to provide greater aid for the French in Syria.

The strain between France and her former ally, Britain, was heightened by the French report that British planes yesterday attacked Stax, Tunisia, a north African possession, less than 24 hours after Vichy formally protested a British bombing of the island on Wednesday.

The British bombardment was directed at an Italian merchant ship moored in the harbor. The French acknowledged Britain had threatened sharp reprisals on the French for any active collaboration with the axis.

A dispatch to Vichy telling of the attack upon Stax declared, "The French navy will and the air force are assuring the defense of Stax." But it did not say how specifically.

The war in Africa, now subsidiary to developments in the eastern Mediterranean, still found the British holding out at Tobruk, Libya, under aerial and air harassment after 60 days of siege. Linked with an aerial assault yesterday was an attack by German desert artillery which the high command said had blown up a munitions dump.

In the Egyptian desert, where axis forces now stand as an incipient threat to the Alexandria harbor and the Suez canal, German Stukas and fighter planes, joined by Italian bombers, were said to have attacked the British lines.

A British campaign was reported to a British campaign of mopping up minor pockets of Italian resistance. Italian garrisons, Rome said, were continuing to resist "preponderant British forces."

The air battle of Britain and the war of the seas, also overshadowed by the Cite-Ing developments, were marked overnight by German attacks upon Britain's west coast. The Mersey region of Liverpool and the Mersey estuary were hit.

A German submarine added to the mounting toll of British shipping with a report that 44,000 tons had been sent recently to the bottom.

Through the raking from the air and from under the sea, British first shipload of food from the United States upon the end-lease bill reached a British port.

More than 25,000 workers are now employed in army armaments in the U. S., compared with 15,000 workers in 1939.

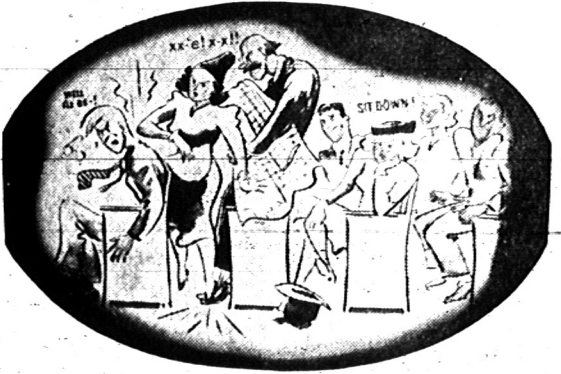
