Japanese Risk Anglo-American Resentment

Offer Part Of Indo-China To Thailand (Siam) For Allegiance

Japan's swing to the south against the Anglo-American axis today, taking new Anglo-American resentment. A Reuters British news agency report from Bangkok said Japan had offered Cambodia and Laos, which are part of French Indo-China, to Thailand (Siam) in return for her allegiance to Japan's new order in Asia.

Such a division of Indo-China would violate the Japanese protocol signed in Vichy today, which pledges Japan to "respect the territorial integrity of French Indo-China and the sovereign rights of France over all parts of the Indo-China union."

British authorities in Shanghai said they would protest if Thailand were forced to grant special privileges to any third party—obviously, a reference to Japan—and they scoffed at Tokyo broadcasts that British forces in North Malaya were an active threat to the "Chai."

Informing Shanghai quarters were that the Japanese had been served demands on Thailand but observed that the Japanese had made similar charges of outside "threats" just before making demands for bases in southern Indo-China.

At Hanoi, 40,000 Troops
The Japanese announced officially that they had moved 40,000 troops into Indo-China. Troops already have moved into bases at Nhatrang, 300 miles northeast of Saigon, and Tourane, 300 miles up the coast from Saigon.

Other warships were approaching Saigon to land still more Japanese, expected to take over posts dominating the east coast, the Thailand border and the upper half of the Gulf of Siam.

In Vichy, France's Vice Premier Admiral Jean Darlan and Japanese Ambassador Saburo Hatake signed a protocol for the common defense of French Indo-China, binding the governments to military co-operation as long as circumstances demand.

Japanese developments in the east crisis indicated that an eastward move may be forthcoming.

1. In Shanghai, American officials reported that Japanese sentries had been stationed outside American oil company properties at Ningbo and Dairen, halting all business.

2. In Sydney, Army Minister Percy Spender announced that about one-quarter of Australia's military force was called upon for full-time service beginning Oct. 1.

3. The London radio said an order had been issued in Cape Town, South Africa, to detain the 5,000-ton Japanese freighter Manilla Maru, headed for Japan, "up a full cargo."

4. In San Francisco, the luxurious Japanese liner Tatsumi Maru, carrying nearly 100 American passengers and a \$250,000 cargo of raw silk aboard, was reported still continuing its time-marking cruise off the Pacific coast.

First Information to Japan
Tokyo, July 29.—A Japanese correspondent aboard a Japanese warship steaming outward for the occupation of French Indo-China reported today that the overwhelming sentiment of the Japanese navy is "clear the way, disturbers of peace, let us protect Indo-China from international intrigue."

Domestic authoritative Japanese agency, published the dispatch from Correspondent Yasuo Oya.

The government published the text of the joint defense agreement between France and Japan, which the Japanese army, navy and air force is moving to take over based in the French colony, thus giving the Japanese people their first detailed information of the movement southward.

A statement by Domel which was not to appear until Wednesday morning papers are out here, said "The army and navy departments of imperial headquarters announce in joint communiqué that additional forces of the army and navy were sent to Indo-China July 27 in accordance with the agreement concluded between Japan and France concerning the joint defense of Indo-China."

The Japanese press was sharp in its criticism of the Dutch East Indies as a tool of the United States and Britain, and it seemed the situation undoubtedly would grow worse after the banning of East Indies oil shipments.

This news came close behind new article gasoline rationing. The Standard Oil company has been forced to suspend local retail sales because it is unable to receive payments for its products as a result of the freezing orders.

American business was at a virtual standstill.

The only United States firms not blocked were those in which Japanese had more than 50 per cent interest, such as the Japan plant of International General Electric company.

Germans Claim 19 British Ships Sunk

Say Submarines Scored Great Success In Battle Of Atlantic

Berlin, July 29.—The German high command announced tonight that German submarines had sunk 19 ships totaling 116,500 tons from a British convoy, submitted to an operation for a bowel obstruction at St. Mary hospital Monday. She is recovering from the operation.

"German submarines against have scored a great success in the battle of the Atlantic," said a special communiqué from Adolf Hitler headquarters on the Russian front.

"Harassed by destroyers, the German submarines sank 19 ships, including 10 destroyers, 10 cargo ships and 10 auxiliary ships, totaling 116,500 tons."

"Particular success of the German units they destroyed one destroyer and one corvette."

An earlier announcement indicated most of the sinking occurred yesterday and last night.

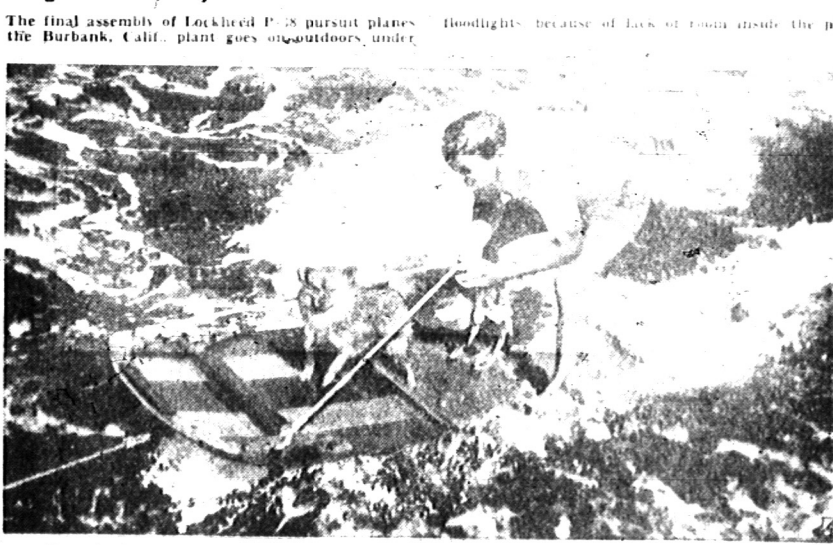

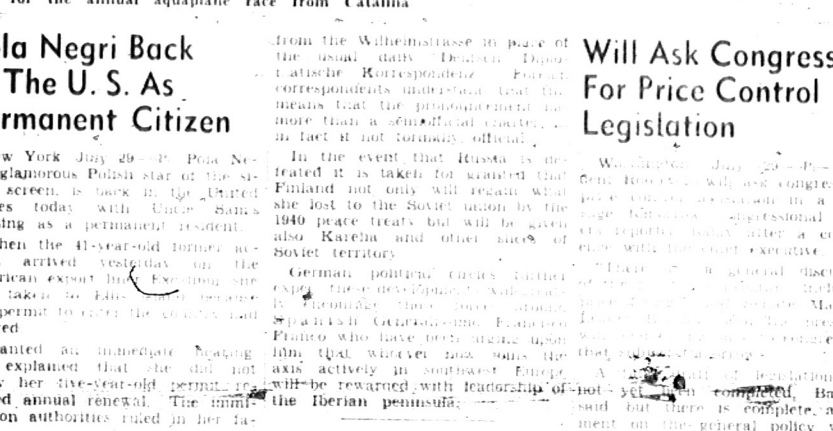
Shocking This sudden shower of cold water from a garden hose was startling to the British troops.

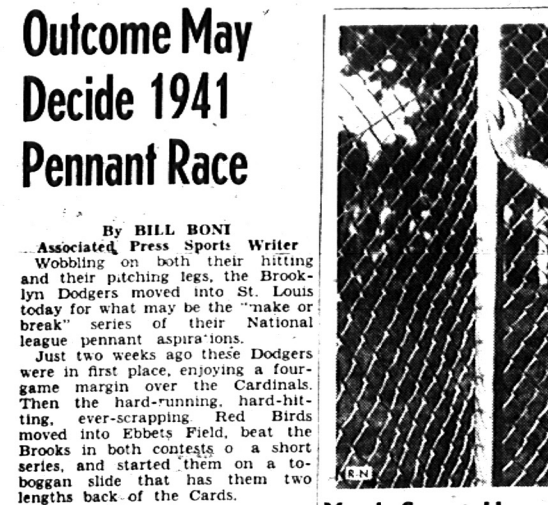

War In Russia Further Cuts Japan's Trade

German Goods Blocked
Via Trans-Siberian
Railroad

Tokyo, July 29—(UP)—Japan faces new and unprecedented economic hardships as a result of the Russo-German war which has virtually isolated Japan from Europe economically, and has confronted the nation with new difficulties in obtaining raw materials.

The Asahi Shimbun, a conservative and influential Tokyo newspaper, reported that Japanese financial leaders were advising the government to re-examine its recently drafted plans to convert Japan into a "national defense state" because the conflict between Russia and Germany had made the original program impractical.

Asahi said that even before the outbreak of the Russo-German war Japanese raw material shortages were

forcing factories to close down or reduce operations.

Greater Conservation Seen

Financial quarters predict that the new economic problems now facing Japan will result inevitably in a stricter conservation of raw materials.

Japanese business leaders see little hope of offsetting the loss of European trade by a corresponding in-

crease in trade with the United States and are pointing out that the United States has been curtailing exports of vital materials due to American rearmament effort.

On top of this, it is expected that the United States now will begin diverting supplies to Russia and further curtail exports to Japan.

German machinery halted Japanese importations of machinery from Germany fell off sharply after the outbreak of the European war. Some machinery was delivered to Japan via the Trans-Siberian railway, but Japanese trade papers assert that the shipments were limited. However, now Japan faces complete isolation from Germany.

Industrial circles advocate a readjustment of the nation's economic planning program under which the country would concentrate on industries which can be supplied raw materials from the Far East.

This aim undoubtedly might lead eventually to opening trade negotiations with the Dutch East Indies.

However, the immediate prospects indicate that Japan will be driven more and more into the confines of the yen bloc.

Psychologist Is Compiling Huge Book On Science

Sacramento, Cal., July 29—(INS)—Dr. Raymond H. Wheeler, psychologist and guest professor at the College of the Pacific at Stockton, is compiling all the known data of human experience and is recording it in what he terms the largest book of scientific fact ever written.

When finished the book will measure 7 1/2 feet in length and 4 1/2 feet in width. It will be classified by fields of endeavor and by years, the discoveries, inventions and variations in human behavior occurring since historical time began.

The reader, Dr. Wheeler points out, may at a glance determine what was going on in any object in any year, and he may trace the history of any certain activity through the years.

Some 650,000 items have been entered in the book during the last five years and an estimated 1,250,000 more items will be added before it is finished within the next five years.

Two-Weeks-Old Bread Planned For Soldiers

New Orleans, July 29—(AP)—An army bakery that will provide bread for the half million troops in the gigantic late summer maneuvers in Louisiana today began turning out on a mass scale of "cured" loaves that will stay edible for two weeks.

Today's schedule called for enough bread for 22,000 soldiers. The production will be stepped up until the bakery working around the clock seven days a week, is turning out 225,000 pounds of bread every 24 hours.

Eleven hundred soldiers bakers from six southern states have been brought here to produce the bread, which is baked in 112 kerosene ovens in a 500-foot long shed at Jackson barracks.

Major Harry Fenton, executive officer at the barracks, said the bakery is larger than any unit set up on European battlefields.

The first shipment of bread baked today will be shipped out August 3 since the loaves will need 24 to 48 hours of "curing" after the baking and cooling is completed.

When the half billion soldiers begin their maneuvering through central Louisiana in September in the greatest war games ever held in America the bread will be shipped to them in the field.

Officers said the first loaves baked in the huge kitchen were two-pound garrison loaves but soon would be supplanted by "field" loaves which are circular rather than oblong and are about twice the size of garrison loaves.

Use Black Widow Spider Eggs To War On Spiders

Los Angeles, July 29—(INS)—Have you any black widow spider eggs around the house?

Southern California scientists want to know because the eggs are needed to stem an invasion of black widow spiders in the sugar and pineapple plantations of the Hawaiian islands.

Dr. W. Dwight Pierce, noted entomologist at the Los Angeles County Museum, explained that a tiny wasp parasite feeds on black widow spider eggs; most vicinities where the deadly spider is found.

He said that the wasp, known as Bacus California Pierce, is one of nature's most formidable foes against the lethal black widow.

Hence we need more eggs to get more wasps," Dr. Pierce, discoverer of the wasp and for whom the species was named, said. "Persons sending in egg are asked to describe the exact locality from which they were taken, that distribution can be mapped."

The wasps, he said, will be sent to the islands in the war on the poisonous pests.
