Charges Russia Mexican Revolt And Nazis Plot

Plan To Set Up Puppet Government On Door-step Of The U. S.

Washington, April 13.—(AP)—Rep. Don Edwards said today he had information that Russia and Germany were plotting to bring on a revolution in Mexico and set up a puppet government on the door-step of the United States.

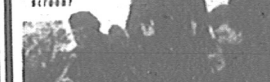

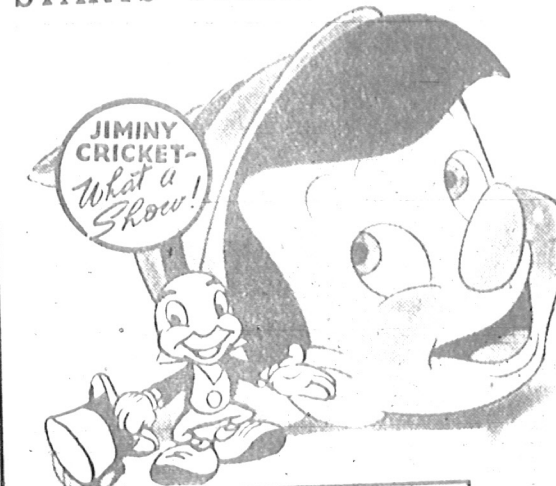

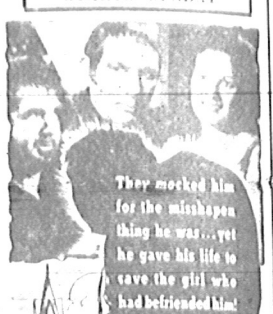
