DENHARDT IS WITNESS FOR OWN DEFENSE

Jury Visits Scene of the Alleged Crime.

WELL GUARDED

New Castle, Ky., April 29 (UPI)—The love affair of two handsome people, which led one to her death and the other to trial on charges of murder, was related to a Henry county jury today by Brigadier General Henry H. Denhardt.

Denhardt, on trial charged with murdering Mrs. Verma Carr Taylor, was first witness for his own defense.

He telephoned her regarding a real estate deal one day shortly after they had met, he said.

"She asked how I was," he testified, "and I said all right except that I was lonely. She laughed and said she was pretty lonely, too. So I said we handsome people ought to get together and so we went out together."

They went out frequently after that, in his automobile.

"Then," Denhardt said, "I began to know that I loved her."

Roxie K. Myers, defensive counsel, waived opportunity to make an opening statement.

Difficult to Hear
Despite caution by Judge Charles C. Marshall to raise his voice the soldier-phlegm testified in a low tone that was very difficult to hear above the crowded courtroom's murmur.

The courtroom was packed for the occasion by 800 persons, although normally it holds half that number.

In a wrinkled blue coat, with gray trousers, too tight for his round figure, Denhardt began the story of his life beginning with his birth in Bowling Green 61 years ago.

He related his legal and military experience and told of his separation from his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth Denhardt, in 1932. His invalid sister, Miss Bertha Denhardt, was in court for the first time seated behind the defense counsel table. He lived on his 800-acre farm with his sister after the marital separation.

Met Mrs. Taylor
Denhardt said he met Mrs. Taylor through her brother Dr. E. S. Carr after some discussion over a real estate deal.

Value Estate of Merchant At \$20,000

An estate valued at approximately \$20,000, including property in Italy, is to be divided in accordance with the will of John Puglisi, formerly one of the proprietors of a market at 402 North Schuyler avenue, who died recently.

The will, drawn last Feb. 20 and a codicil added April 19, were filed today in the office of County Clerk Walter J. Richter by Attorney Victor N. Cardost.

The principal heirs are a niece, Nicasia Puglisi, both in Italy. Another niece, Nicasia Bedame, of Italy, is to receive \$100 and a friend, Nick Borino of Kankakee, is to receive \$50.

To the first named niece goes a vineyard in Contrada Arancio, Italy, also another parcel of land in Orto del Angeli and Italian postal bonds. The sister is to receive the income in the remainder of the real estate in Italy, except that the niece is to have the use of three rooms in the home at Caccopola, Italy.

The property in the United States is to be converted into cash and deposited in an Italian bank with the income to go to the sister. At her death the funds go to the niece. The will sets aside \$1,000 to provide for his grave and that of his deceased brother, Michele.

Widow Gets All in Campbell Estate

The will of Charles Campbell, formerly of Yellowhead township who died recently, was filed for probate today in the office of County Clerk Walter J. Richter.

Drawn on Sept. 28, 1928, the will leaves the entire estate to the widow, Johanna, with the expectation that she will provide for their children. The widow is also named executrix.

DRAW LOTS TO DECIDE SHORT OR LONG TERM

Seven Aldermen To Serve 4 Years; Others Two.

SCENE IS TENSE

The spectacle of drawing lots by the newly installed aldermen at last night's council meeting to determine which of the members shall serve two years and which four years added an unusual spice to the evening's activities.

Upon the flip of a coin and the drawing of numbers from a hat resolved their chances for a long term. The audience was tense with excitement and broke out into frequent applause as the councilmen's political fortunes were decided.

Mayor Hattenburg flipped a silver dollar as the aldermen from each ward approached the dias in pairs. The winner of the toss in each case had the right to draw first from the hat in which Mayor Taylor placed two slips bearing the numbers "2" and "4," corresponding to the length of terms.

Those who were lucky on the toss did not prove to be such good pickers in most cases when they drew sight unseen from the hat. Five of the seven who won the toss in their respective wards drew numbers entitling them to the shorter tenure. Those who did draw four-year terms were Elbridge Rogers, First ward, and Urvie Newbold, Fifth ward. Others who will serve for four years as a result of the drawing include Huntington James in the Second, Edmund LaPorte, Third, William Spillane, Fourth; Clarence Sanborn, Sixth, and Myron Deneau, Seventh.

Designated for two-year tenure are J. E. Roach in the First, James Lamb, Second, Jack Boston, Third; David Wood, Fourth; Stanley Boris, Fifth; John Costello, Sixth, and Leo St. Hilaire, Seventh.

Some of the losers were heard to remark that they could have beaten their opponents if the chances had been on chuck-a-luck but the whole affair was taken good-naturedly by all competitors.

Henceforth, half of the 14 aldermen will be elected at the same time as the mayor and the remainder will be voted in two years later. In this manner, seven hold-over councilmen will insure experienced legislators on that body at all times.

Canadian Town Inundated By Waters Of The Thames River

Chatham, Ont., April 29.—Canadian Press. Rescuers helped 100 families to evacuate their homes here today in flight from the swollen Thames river. The stream rose more than two feet over night.

A large part of the city was inundated. The flood level, rising at a rate of from 12 to 18 inches an hour, lacked only 50 feet of putting pumps in the water works out of commission.

City officials, expecting the flood crest hourly, tried to barricade the plant against the spreading river.

Fire department pumps sucked water from one section of the building while laborers shifted 2,000 sandbags against the waterworks wall to plug a hole where a small stream was leaking in.

Two bridges were closed, highways east and south of the city were impassable, and debris-clogged water obstructed approaches to the city's business district.

Thamesville, 16 miles up-river was isolated.

Chicken Dinners for 250 are Lost in Cahan Farm Fire

A strong south wind was blamed for a fire which destroyed a brooder house and 250 young chickens at 9 o'clock this morning on the farm of Frank Cahan, one mile south of the city on highway 49.

The wind blew the fire in the brooder stove against straw and the whole flock was roasted. Firemen from the west side station were summoned and prevented the blaze from spreading to other buildings nearby. Neighboring farmers formed a bucket brigade from the pump to the apparatus to keep the brooder tank supplied with water.

FRANK JENSEN ASKS RECOUNT OF OTTO VOTES

Beaten by E. Doty for Supervisor by 1 Vote.

WRITE IN NAME

A recount of the votes cast for supervisor in the Otto township election April 6 is impending as the result of action taken by Frank Jensen, who was apparently defeated for supervisor.

A canvass of the votes after the election by the polls officials gave 135 votes to Elmer Doty, the incumbent supervisor, and 134 to Jensen, whose name was not printed on the ballot but was written in.

The petition for a recount, filed with County Judge John H. Beckers in behalf of Jensen by Attorney Eva L. Minor, alleges that the election officials refused to count ballots marked for Jensen and counted ballots for Doty not marked for the latter.

Cite 1 Ballot
The petition also contends that at least one ballot marked merely with the name Jensen was not counted but that it should have been since the petitioner was the only contestant by that name.

In addition to asking a recount, the petition requests that if it shows Jensen received more votes than Doty, the former should be declared the winner.

Doty's Denial
In behalf of Doty an answer has been filed by Attorney Anker C. Jensen making a general denial of the petitioner's allegations and further stating that in precinct No. 2 of Otto township 153 voters attempted to vote for Jensen but failed to do so correctly and contends that these votes should not have been counted.

As a result of the petition, Judge Beckers has ordered the ballots impounded but has not yet set a date for the recount, if granted.

NEW CITY HEAD GETS OVATION FROM CITIZENS

Great Floral Tribute Attest to Mayor's Popularity.

GIVES ADDRESS

On a rotunda profusely banked with exquisite floral displays, Albert F. Hattenburg was sworn in as mayor of Kankakee in colorful and elaborate ceremonies Wednesday evening before a capacity crowd in the council chambers of the city hall.

Mayor Hattenburg received the gavel, symbolic of municipal authority, from retiring Mayor Roy D. Taylor and prepared to take up his duties May 1 as the first municipal executive elected by the people for a four-year term.

Double Inauguration
Since he was retiring clerk as well, the new mayor figured on both ends of the oath-administering ceremonies. After he had invested Ralph Farmer with the authority of city clerk, the procedure was reversed and Clerk Farmer administered the mayor's oath to Hattenburg.

The inauguration reached its climax at this point when nine men and four women, all bearing huge baskets of flowers, made their way through the crowd and deposited their tributes, along with many others on the rotunda. The new mayor was accorded a tremendous ovation.

Each Takes Oath
In succession Clerk Farmer then swore in Walter L. Ehrlich as city treasurer; Edward Hoennicke as police magistrate; and the 14 newly elected aldermen. Each repeated the oath—"I do solemnly swear to support the constitution of the United States and of the state of Illinois and to faithfully discharge the duties of this office in and for the city of Kankakee to the best of my ability."

In his inaugural remarks, Mayor Hattenburg thanked the people of

LITTLE Prince Wenceslaus, son of Emperor Charles IV of Germany, was beginning to toddle and talk when, at the age of 2, he was crowned King of Bohemia. It was 1383, when Germany was torn with feuds and the people were beginning to seek relief from papal domination.

At the age of 9 Wenceslaus was married, and when he was only 15, shortly after his father's death, he became ruler of Germany. As soon as he began to feel his oats, however, Wenceslaus quarreled with the papal throne. He was made prisoner in 1394, but was soon released.

He was deposed in 1400 and when, in his impotence, he quarreled with his half-brother, Sigismund, King of Hungary, he was cast into jail for 19 months, while Sigismund ruled Bohemia. But the luckless Wenceslaus again became ruler of Bohemia when Sigismund died. He ruled the Duchy of Luxembourg, and it was in his honor that a stamp bearing his portrait was issued late in 1935. He died in 1419, at the age of 58.
