# Dulles Offers New Program For Germany

New York, Jan. 18 (UP)—A proposal from highly-placed German officials for the internationalization of some German industrial resources was made today as a new test of cooperation between Democrats and Republicans on foreign policy.

The proposal, an evolutionary program which would begin a gradual economic federation of Western Europe, was made last night by John Foster Dulles, a leading foreign policy spokesman. He had advance endorsement of the plan from Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York and Chairman Arthur H. Vandenberg of the senate foreign relations committee, both prominent figures in the new-democratic party.

Internationalization of German resources was said to be the main purpose of the program, which would be a series of steps leading to a new test of cooperation between Democrats and Republicans on foreign policy.

Washington, Jan. 18 (UP)—Congressional leaders today indicated that they favor early reductions in army-navy spending.

# List Chairmen Of State Senate Committees

Springfield, Ill., Jan. 18. (UP)—Lt. Gov. Hugh W. Cross today announced assignments to the streamlined committees of the new state senate.

Cross made the appointments after conferring with Sens. Edward E. Laughlin, R. Freeport, senate president pro tem, and William J. Conners, D. Chicago, minority leader. They will be given to the senate for confirmation soon after the general assembly meets again Jan. 28.

Republicans, who have a 37 to 13 majority in the senate, again controlled all committees and held all chairmanships. Cross gave them 183 committee seats and the Democrats 65.

Only three chairmen named by Cross did not head the same or similar committees in the last assembly. Succeeds Beckman

They are John T. Thomas, Belleville, who succeeds the late Louis E. Beckman, Kankakee, as head of the banks, building and loan associations committee; George D. Mills, Chicago, succeeding Norman G. Flagg, Moro, who did not seek reelection to the senate, as elections committee chairman; and Paul Broyles, Mt. Vernon, who succeeds Mills as head of the committee to visit educational institutions.

Reorganization of the senate's committee system cut the number of standing committees from 26 to 23 and the membership of most committees from 15 to 12. Most committees now will have nine members compared to last session's 10 and five, respectively.

Maximum of Five

Another new rule held each senator to membership on a maximum of five committees.

Wallace Thompson, Galesburg, again will head the important judiciary committee and T. Mac Downing, Macomb, will be chairman of the appropriations committee. Wilbur J. Cash, Towanda, was renamed chairman of the industrial affairs committee, which probably will consider any fair employment practices bills introduced.

Other chairmen will be: Aeronautics and military affairs, Everett R. Peters, St. Joseph; agriculture, Simon E. Lantz, Congerville; contingent expense, R. G. Crisnerberry, Murphysboro; education, Robert W. Lyons, Oakland; efficiency and economy, Rice Miller, Hillsboro; enrolling and engrossing, George C. Armstrong, Lawrenceville; executive, Charles F. Carpenter, East Moline; fish and game, Frank J. Dick, Quincy.

Highways and traffic regulations, Ray Paddock, Round Lake; insurance, Arthur J. Bidwell, River Forest; municipalities, Dennis J. Collins, DeKalb; public welfare and civil service, Arthur Van Hooser, Metropolis; public utilities and railroads, William G. Knox, Chicago; revenue, Charles W. Baker, Davis Junction; rules, Walker Butler, Chicago.

To visit charitable institutions, Frederick W. Rensick, Bug, and to visit penitentiaries, Ora A. Oldfield, Centerville.

Vice chairmen will be named later. Announcement of house of representatives committees is not expected for about a week.

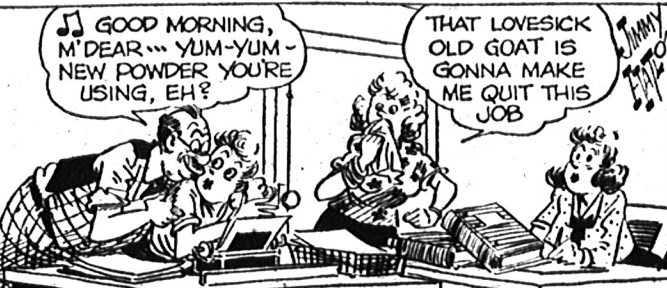

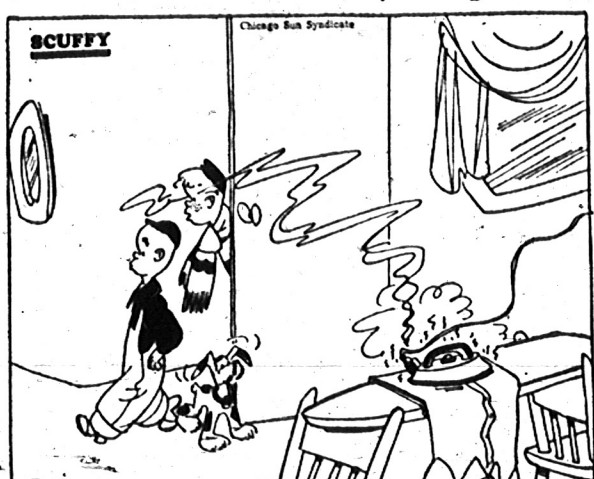
